



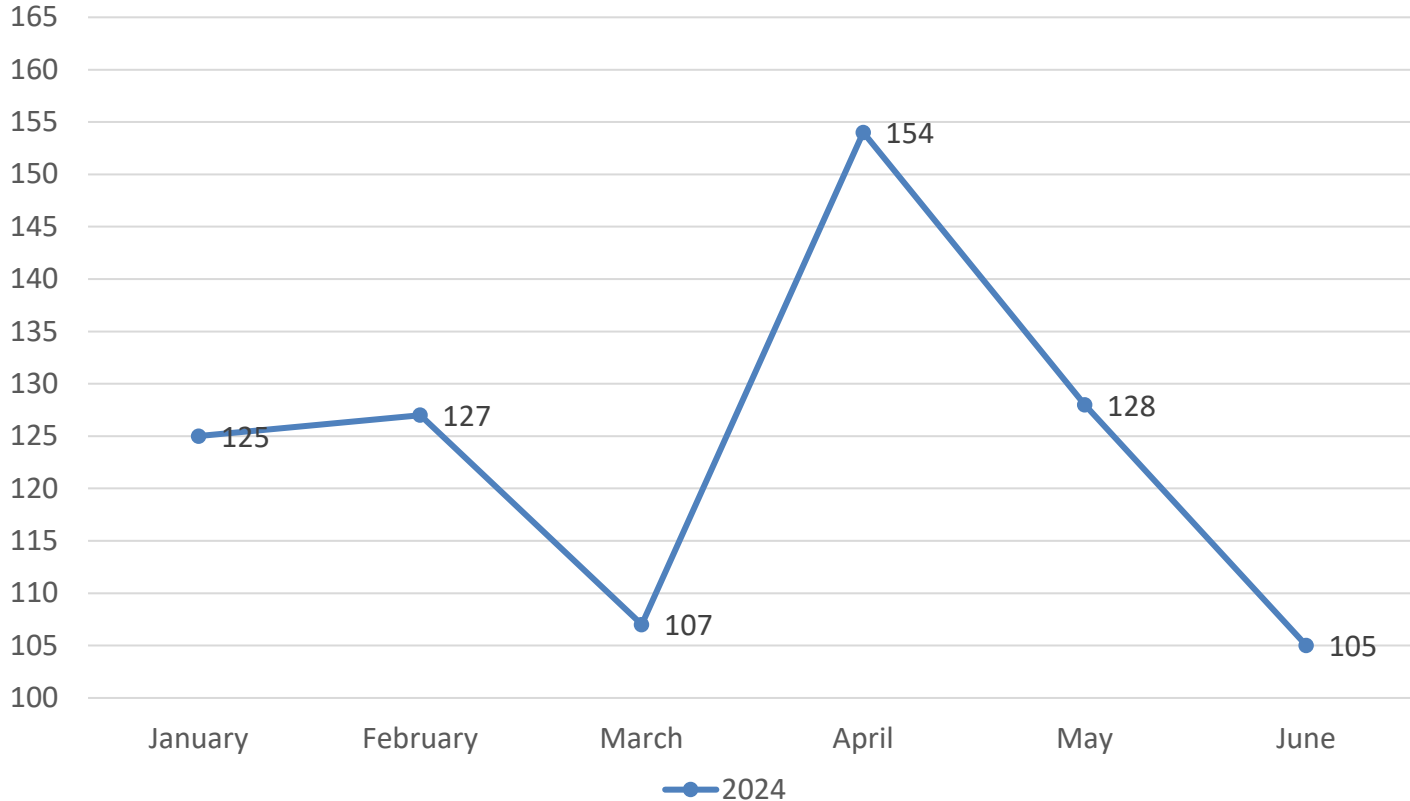
## 2024 1<sup>st</sup> Half MUI Data Review

# 2024 1<sup>st</sup> Half MUI Statistics

- 742 categories filed so far in 2024. This puts Summit County on pace for 1,484 categories for the year.
  - In 2023, 1,457 categories were filed.
- By MUI Rule appendix category:
  - Category A – 38.3% (2023 – 39.7%)
  - Category B – 22.5-% (2023 – 21.4%)
  - Category C – 39.2% (2023 – 38.9%)

# 2024 1<sup>st</sup> Half MUI Statistics

Total categories filed per month



Monthly average is 124.3 categories or 5.83 per day

# Category A MUIs

- Neglect is the most opened Category A MUI (71)
  - Supervision Neglect (38) is currently outpacing Treatment Neglect (33)
- Other notable categories:
  - Misappropriation (62)
    - Identified PPI: Unknown (50%), DSP (18%), Family (10%)
  - Verbal Abuse (61)
    - Identified PPI: DSP (47%), Unknown (28%), Other (13%)
  - Physical Abuse (53)
    - Identified PPI: Unknown (35%), DSP (33%), Family (20%)

# Category B MUIs

- Significant Injury (54) is the most opened Category B
  - Significant Injuries are on pace for a 38.4% increase from 2023. These MUIs occurring specifically due to falls are also increasing, but at a lower rate.
  - Random accidents/unknown injuries are the second leading cause.
- Other notable categories
  - Missing Individual (32) – 4 individuals account for 50% of total
  - Peer to Peer (31) – no recurring trends between specific individuals

# Category C MUIs

- Unanticipated Hospitalizations are the most common MUI overall (215) and set to slightly exceed 2023's total.
- Law Enforcement (34) – on pace for a 33% increase from 2023
  - Domestic Violence, Assault, Making Threats are the most common charges filed
  - Vast majority of cases occur in non-staffed settings
- Unapproved Behavioral Supports (41) are on pace for a 7% decline.
  - 5 individuals account for 41% of total

# Individual MUI Trends – Nickel/Dime

**Nickel** = 5 to 9 MUI categories filed in a 6-month period

**Dime** = 10 or more MUI categories filed in a 12-month period

- MUI Trends are to be clearly identified and addressed in the ISP.
- In the most recent quarterly review, there were 15 individuals with a Nickel trend and 9 individuals with a Dime trend.
  - This was an overall decrease of 2 from the end of Q1 2024.
  - 7 individuals were new to these trends while 12 individuals dropped off from the previous review.



# Reporting Issues

- MUI Failure to Report is on pace to match 2023 (14)
- 34 different providers have had (non-Failure to Report) MUI reporting compliance issues (such as late 4-hour verbal or written reports)
  - 28 Agencies; 6 Independent Providers
  - 8 Agencies have had between 2 and 5 late reporting events
  - 2 Agencies have had 5 or more events
- Reporting issues involving Summit DD staff are on pace to decline about 20% from 2023

# Special Topics

- **Attempted Suicide** – 16 incidents; 13 different individuals
  - No associated substantiated Neglect.
- **Falls** – 32 incidents; 29 different individuals.
  - 3 individuals experienced 2 incidents.
  - No provider or individual trends noted at this time.
  - Most incident causes identifying either losing balance or accidents.
  - Persons with known medical issues (seizures, TBI, other physical ailments) impacting falls appears to be more of a factor this year than the past few years.

# Special Topics

- **Choking** –7 incidents, 7 different individuals.
  - No trends or related Neglect.
- **Supervision Neglect** – 38 incidents. 24 different individuals/groups.
  - Family members being identified as the PPI is becoming more commonplace
  - Only 1 trend with 1 specific provider was noted and addressed by training with Summit DD's MUI department

# Special Topics

- **Misappropriation** - 62 incidents
  - Type: Property (24), Money (14), EBT card (9), Accounts (7), Scams (5)
  - EBT card issues appear to be decreasing, and incidents are more localized as opposed to 2023 which involved many fraudulent out of state charges
  - Location of incident: Staffed/Unstaffed about 50/50
