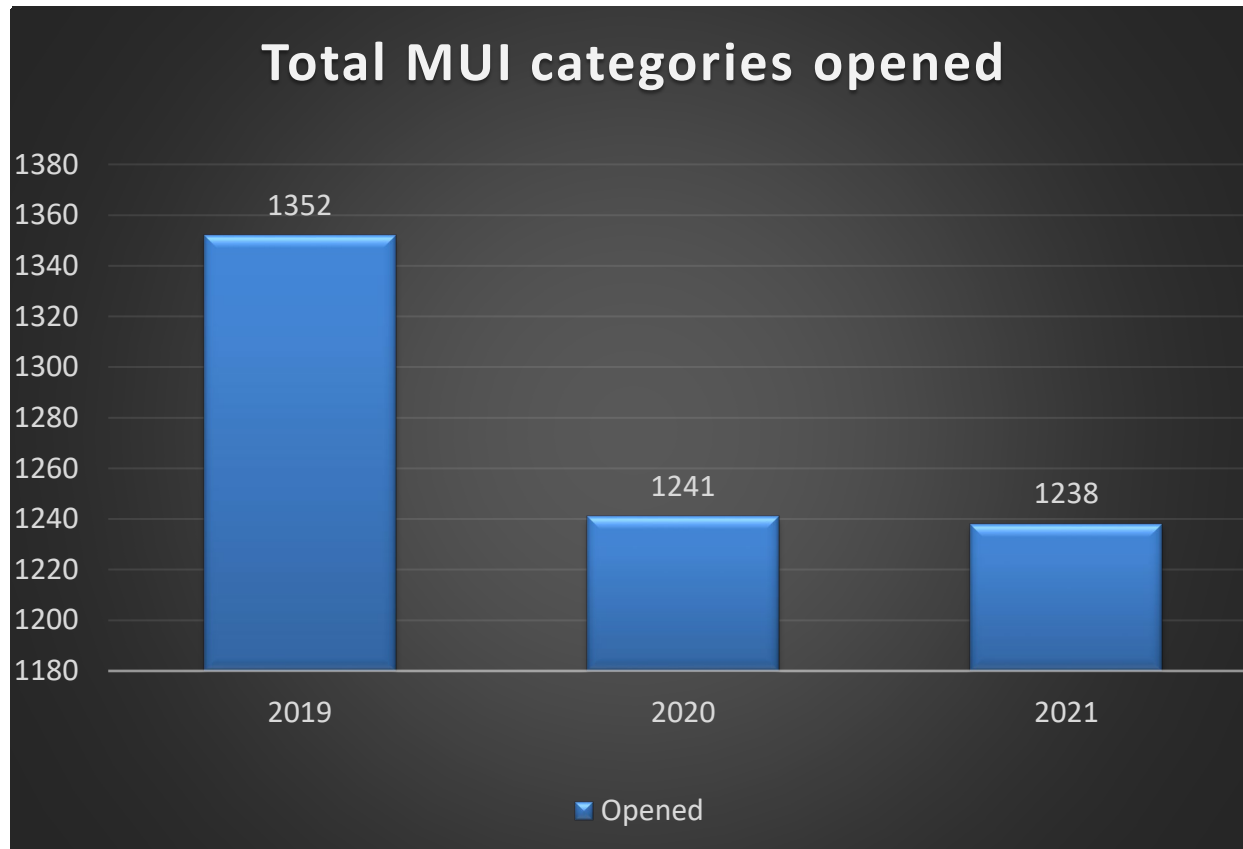
Rule Requirements

- The MUI Rule establishes requirements for addressing major unusual incidents and unusual incidents. This includes the implementation of a continuous quality improvement process in order to **prevent** and/or **reduce** the risk of potential harm to individuals served.

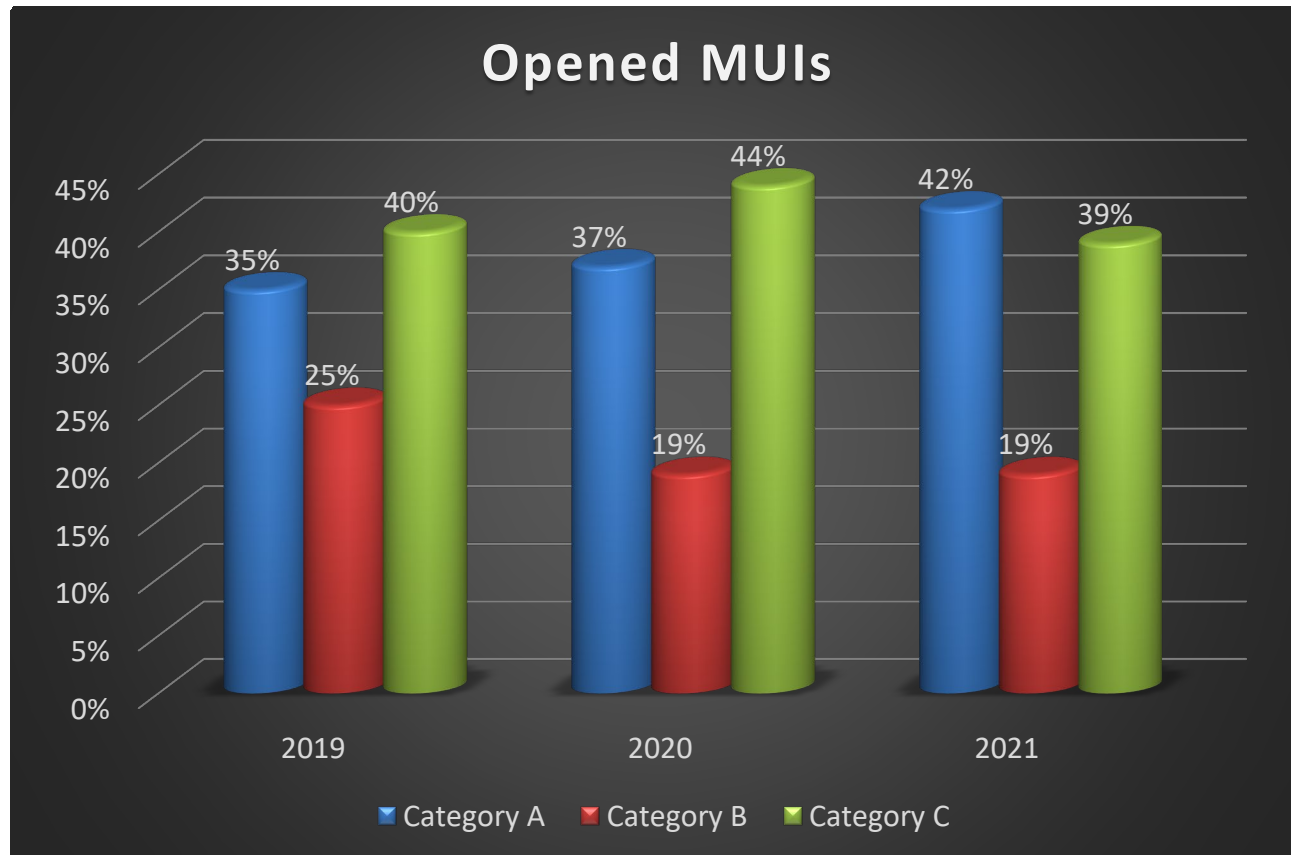
Role of Stakeholder Committee

- The role of the Stakeholder Committee is to review and share data prepared by the county board to identify **trends, patterns, or areas for improving the quality of life** for individuals served in that county.

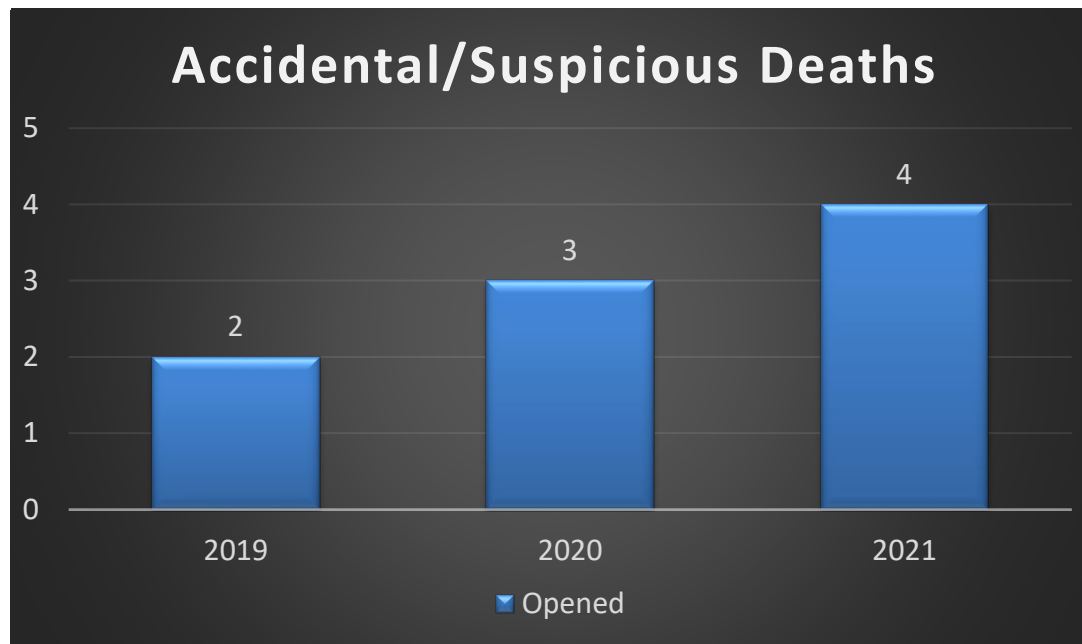

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Accidental/Suspicious Death

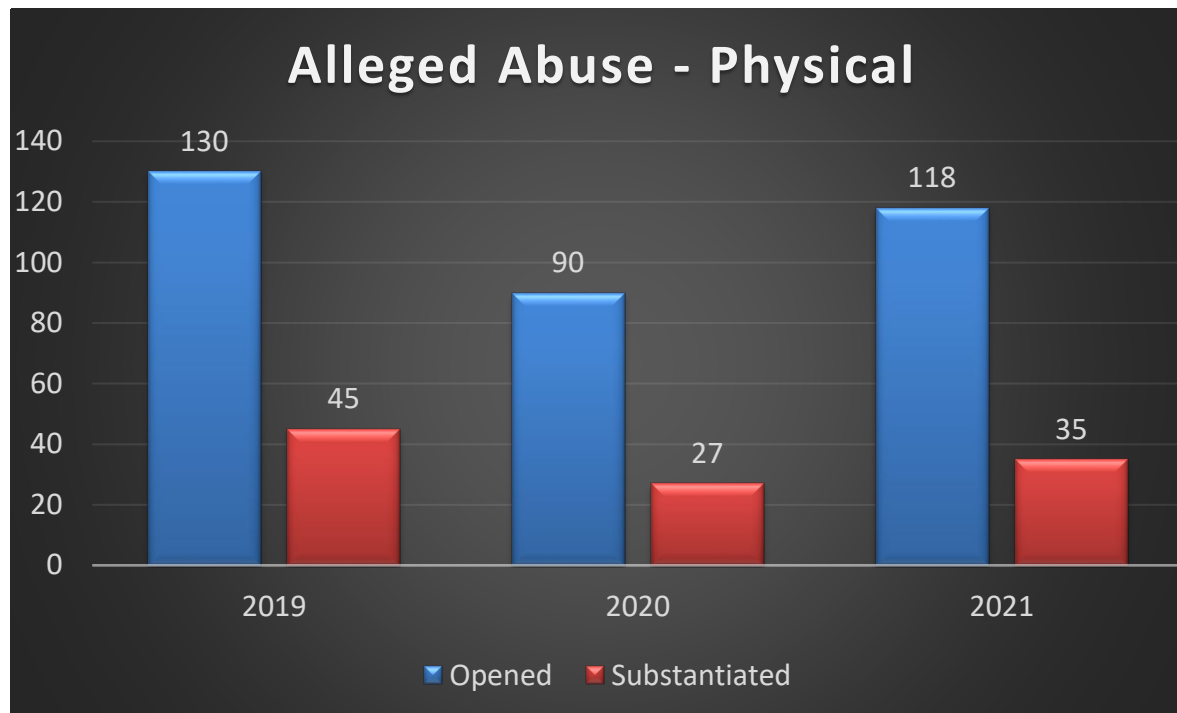
- The death of an individual resulting from accidental or suspicious circumstances



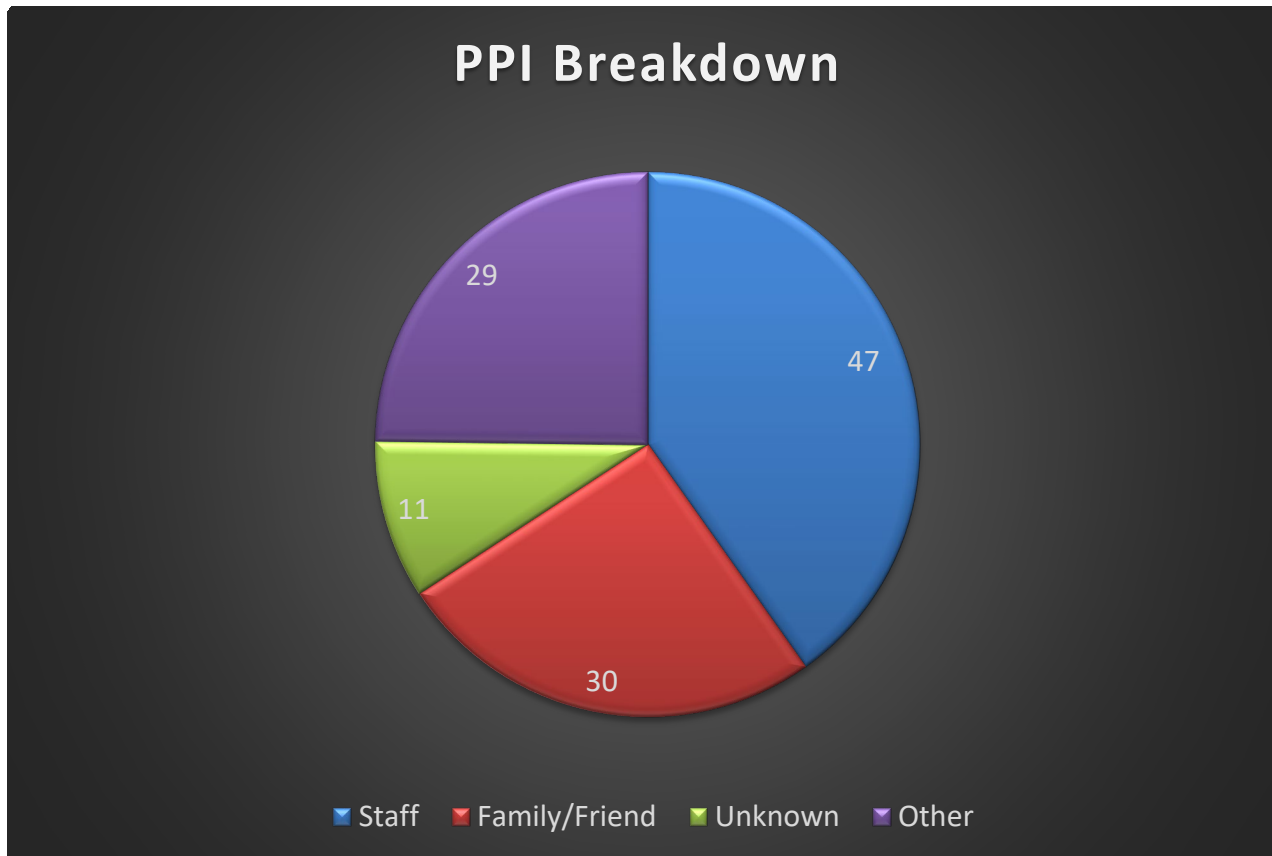
*One incident each from choking, falling, fire and suicide.

Alleged Abuse - Physical

- Physical force which can reasonably be expected to result in harm/injury

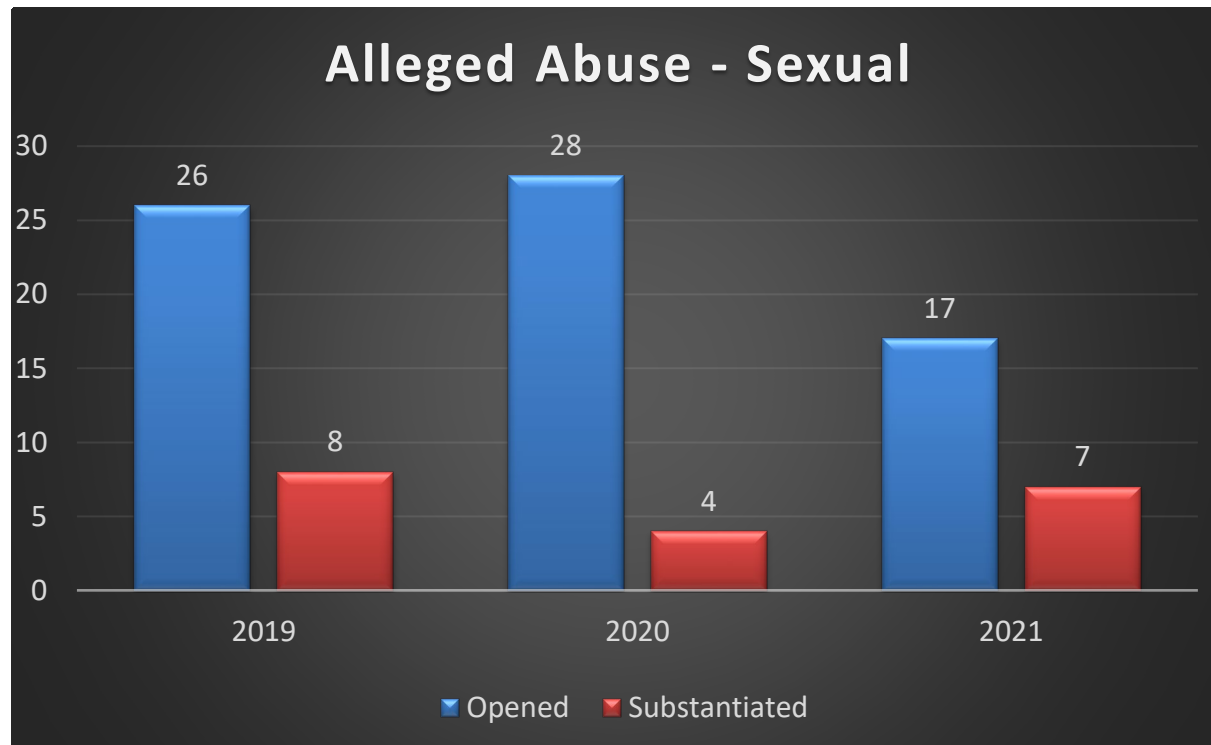


Alleged Abuse - Physical

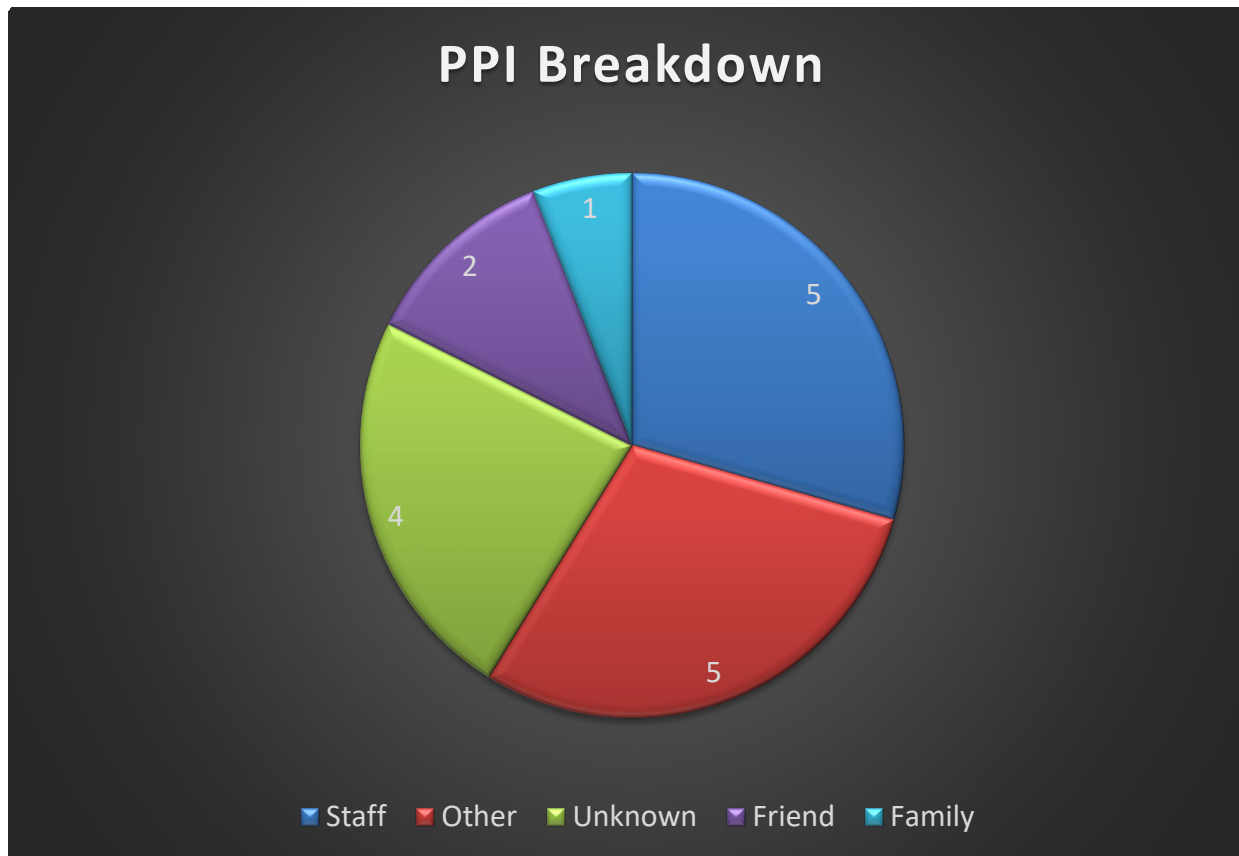


Alleged Abuse - Sexual

- Unlawful sexual conduct or contact with an individual served

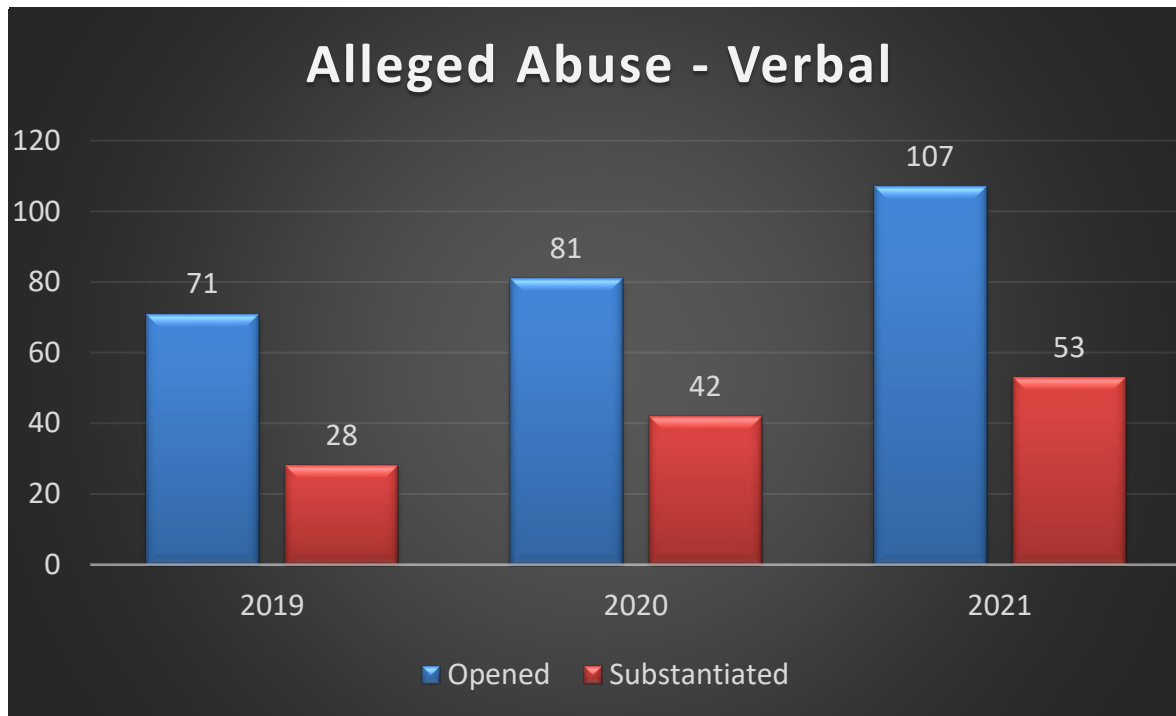


Alleged Abuse - Sexual



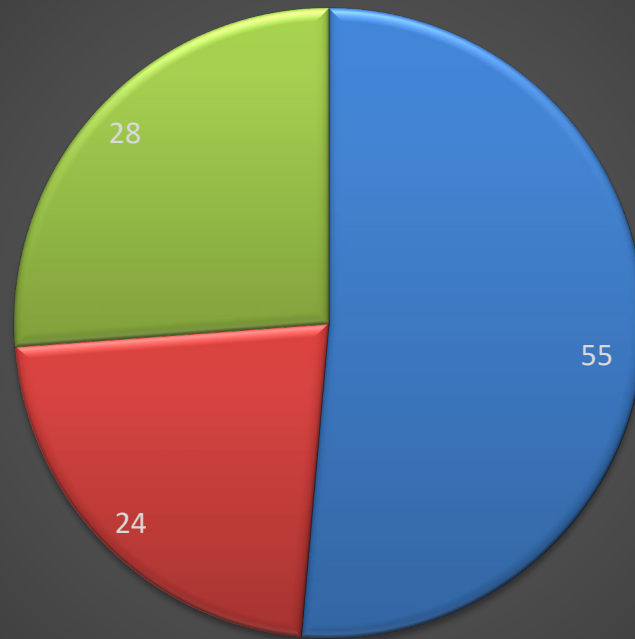
Alleged Abuse - Verbal

- Use of words, gestures, or other communicative means to threaten, coerce, intimidate, harass, or humiliate an individual

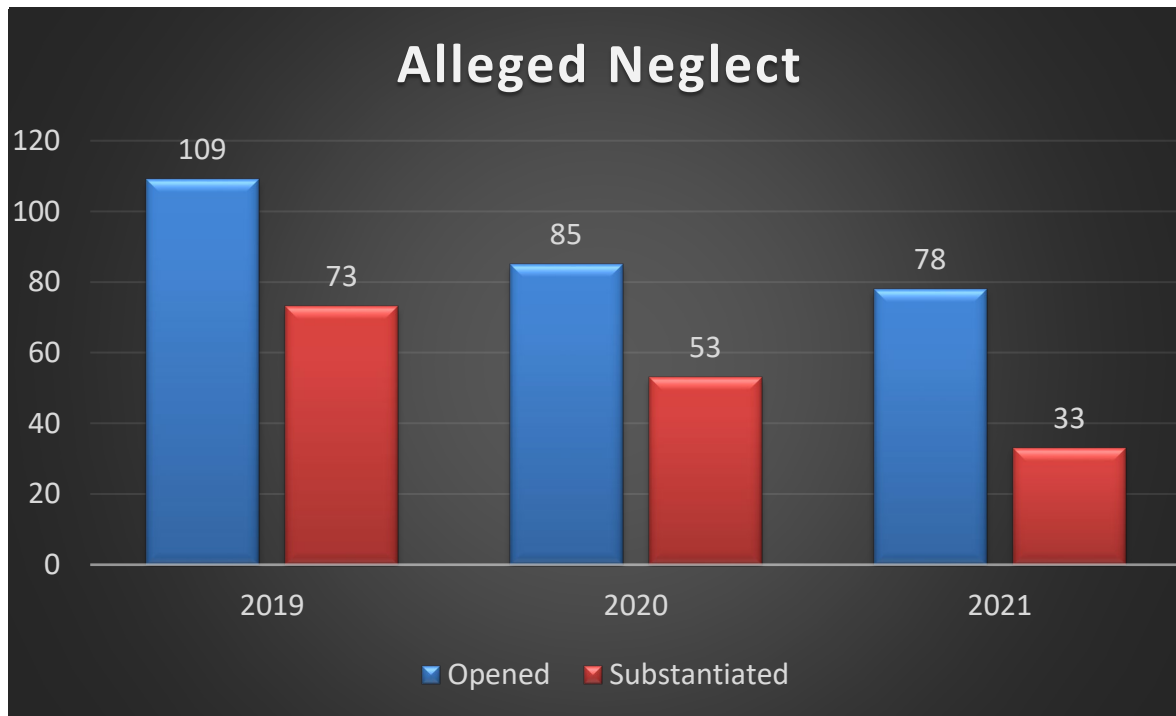
PPI Breakdown



■ Staff ■ No Relationship ■ Family, Friend, Co-worker, etc.

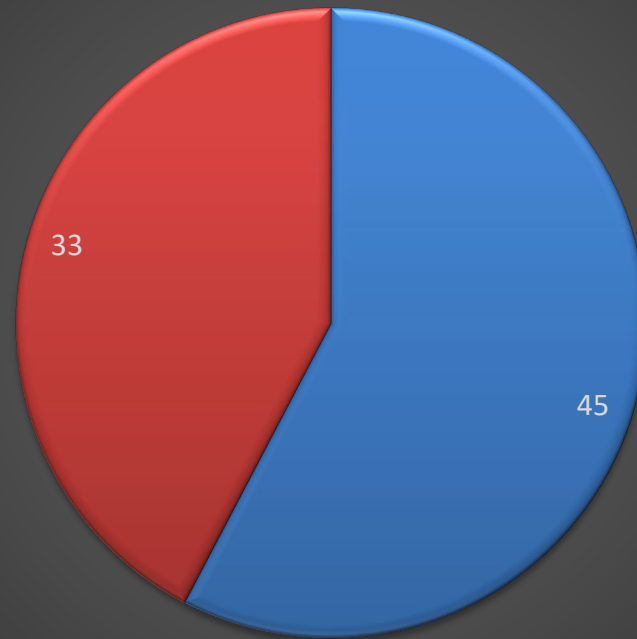
Alleged Neglect

- Failing to provide an individual with medical care, personal care, or other support that results in a serious injury or places an individual or other person at risk of serious injury

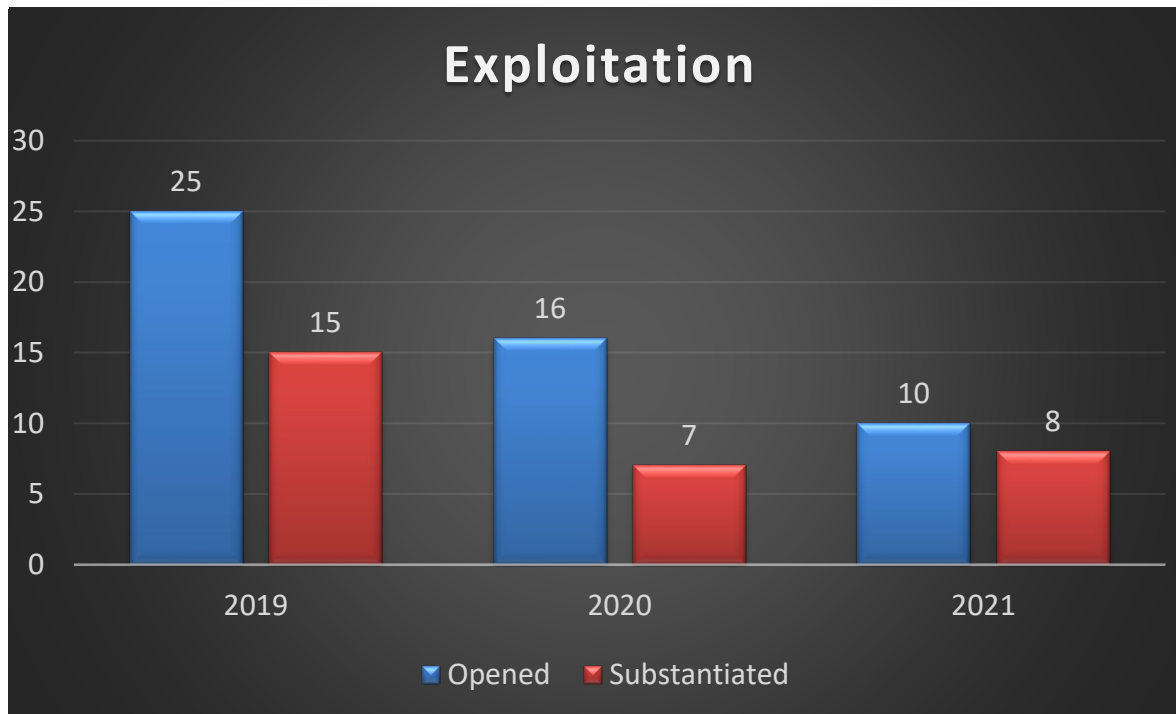
Types of Alleged Neglect in 2021



■ Supervision ■ Treatment

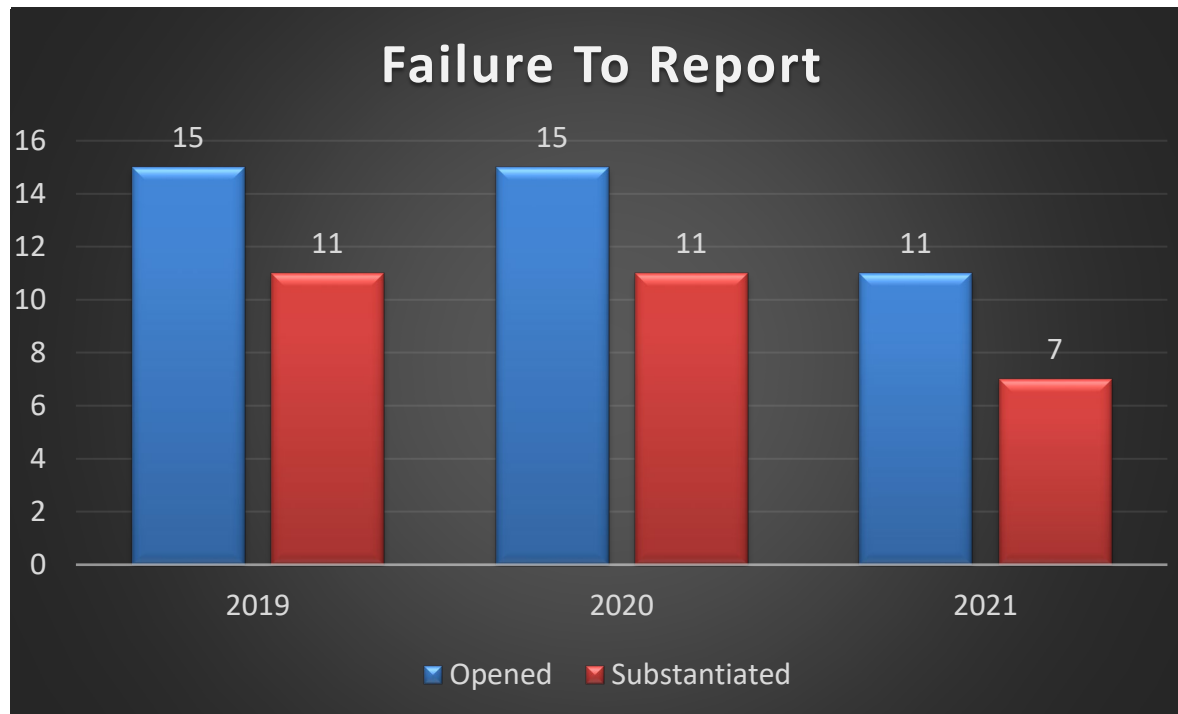
Exploitation

- Unlawfully or improperly using an individual's resources for personal benefit, profit, or gain



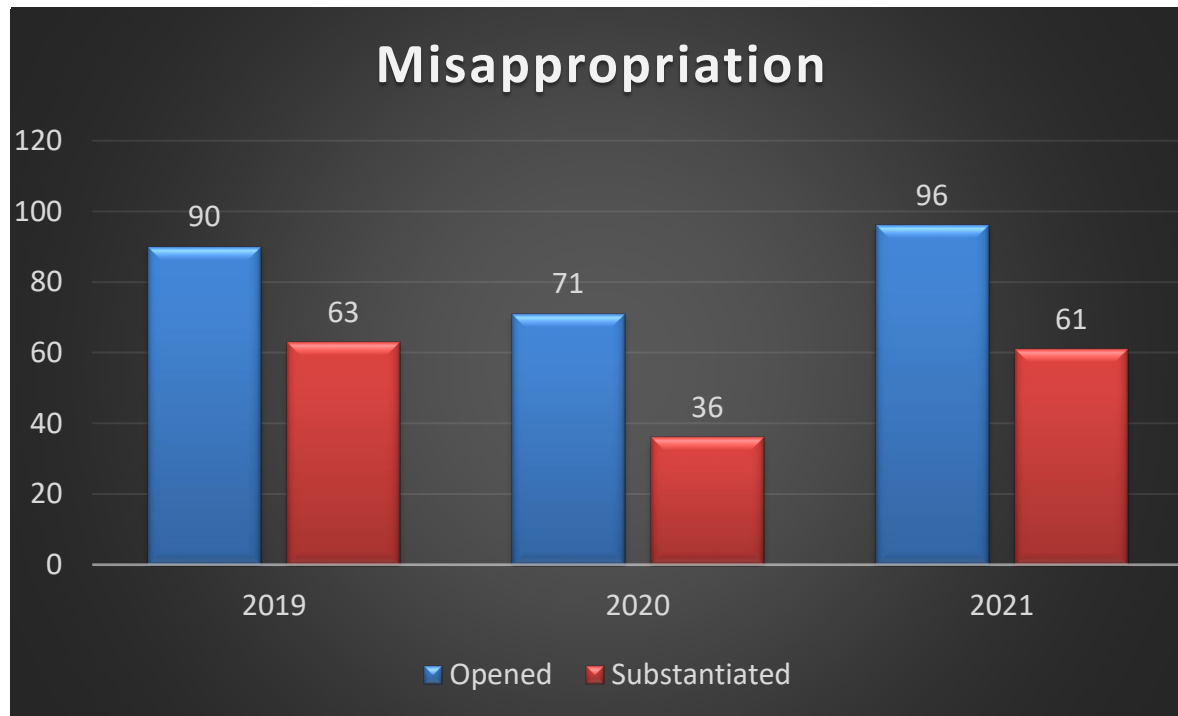
Failure to Report

- A staff person unreasonably fails to report an incident, and that failure results in substantial risk of harm to an individual



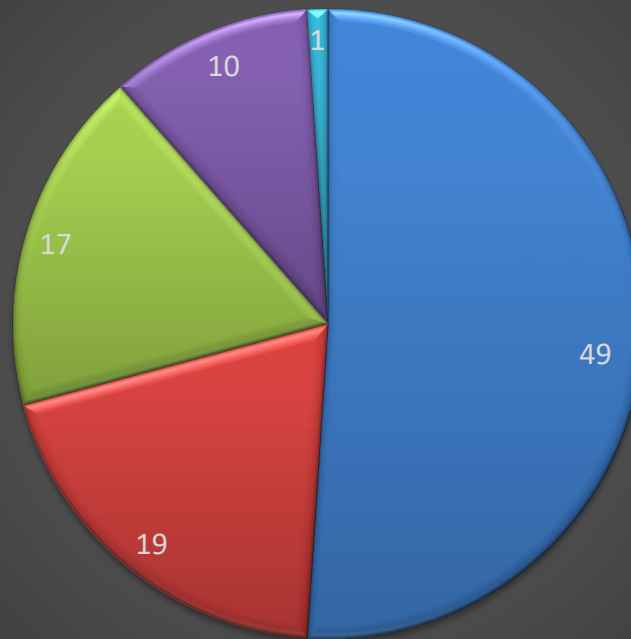
Misappropriation

- Intentionally depriving, defrauding, or otherwise obtaining the real or personal property of an individual served

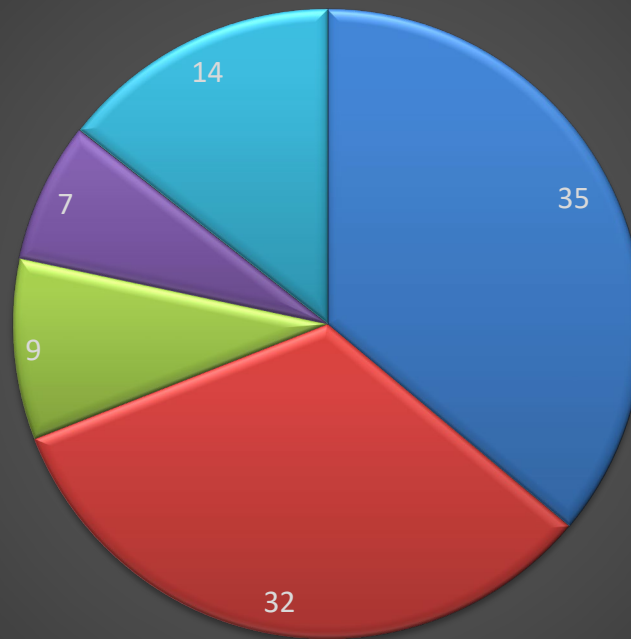
PPI Breakdown

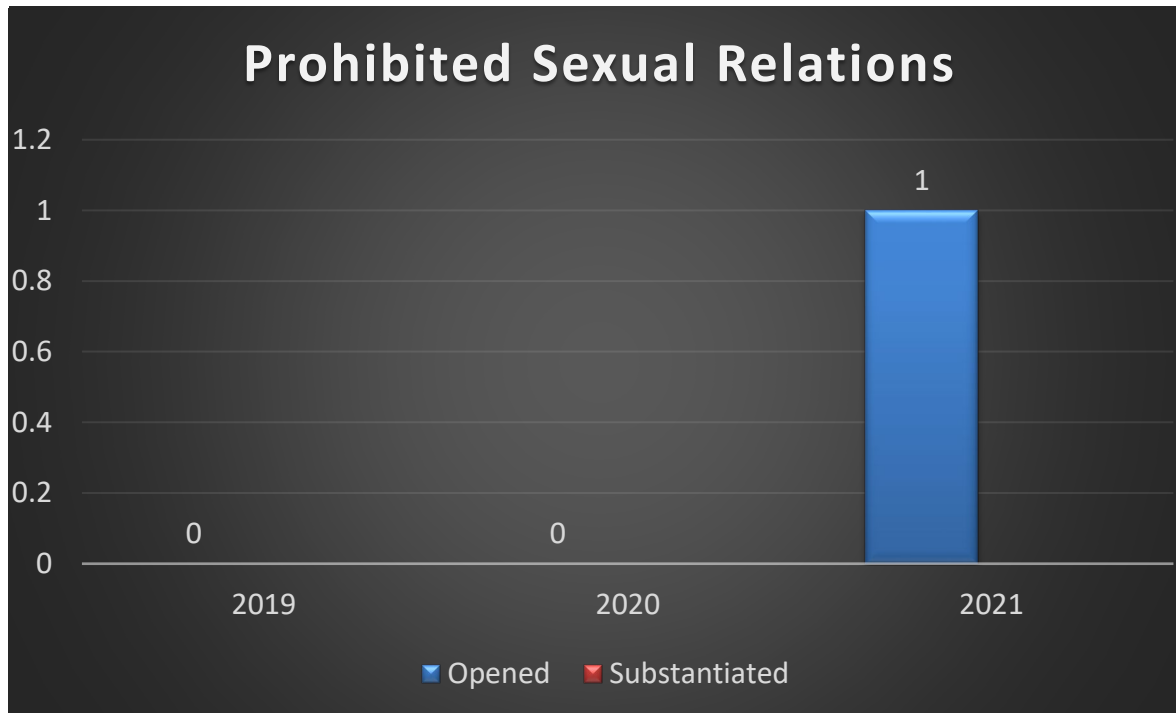
Misappropriation by Type

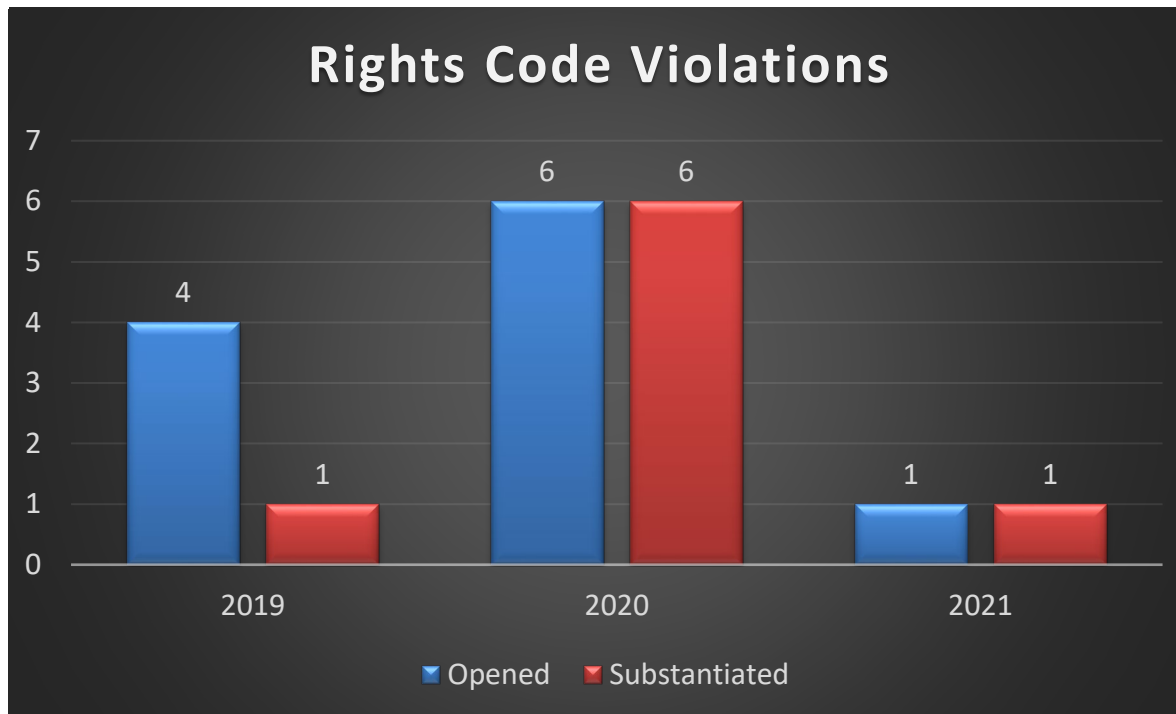
Prohibited Sexual Relations

- Consensual sexual conduct/contact between a DD employee and an individual served (who is not their spouse)



Rights Code Violation

- Any violation of an individual's rights which creates a likely risk of harm to the health and/or welfare of the individual

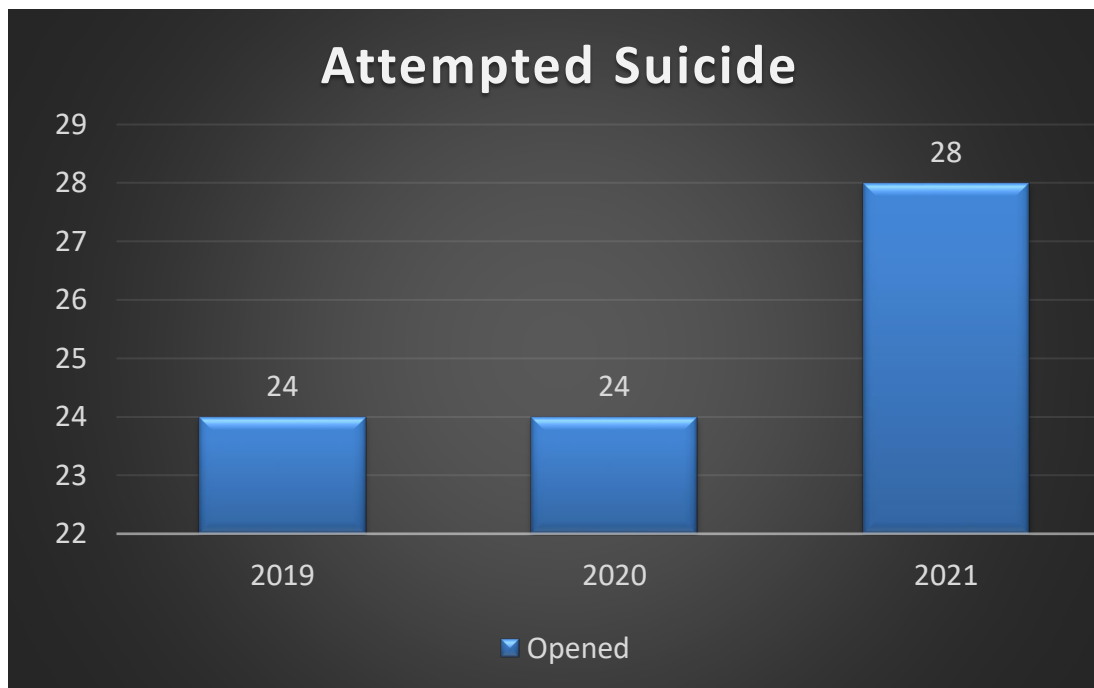

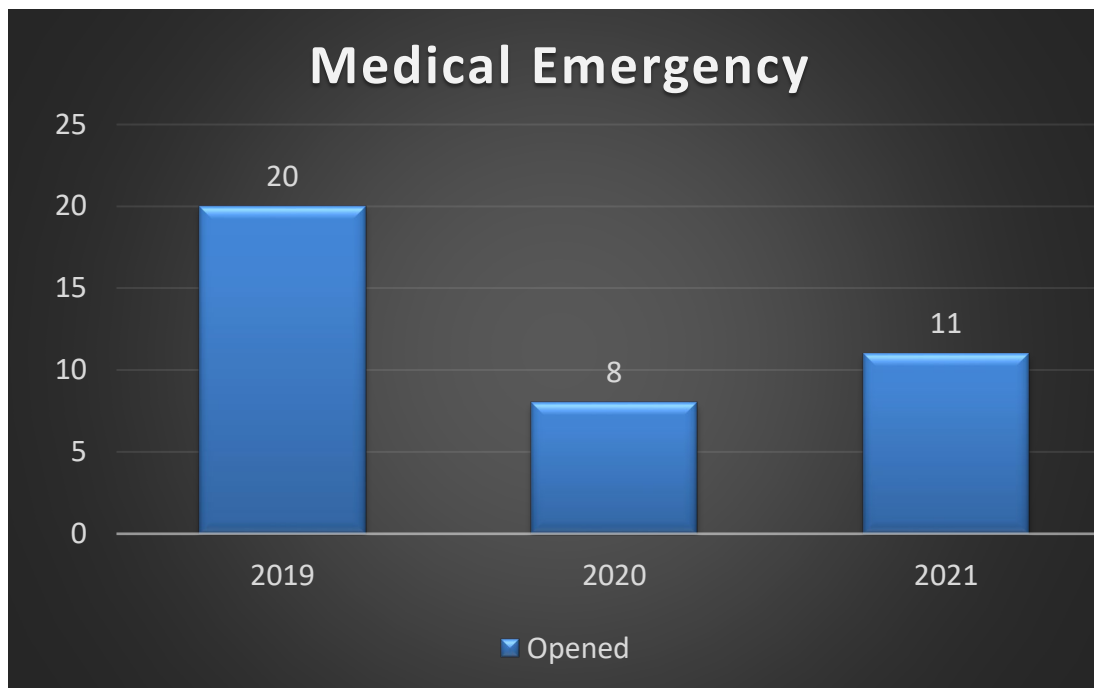
Attempted Suicide

- A physical attempt at suicide which results in ER treatment, inpatient observation, or a hospital admission



Medical Emergency

- An incident where emergency medical intervention is needed to save an individual's life

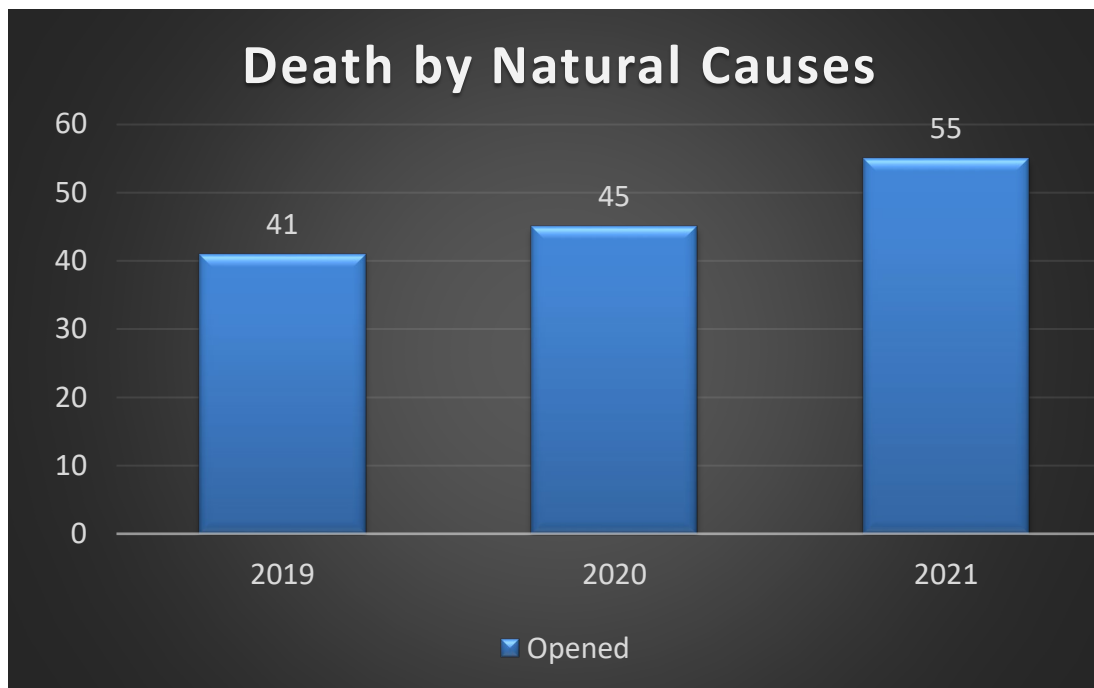
Medical Emergency by Type



■ Choking Relief ■ CPR

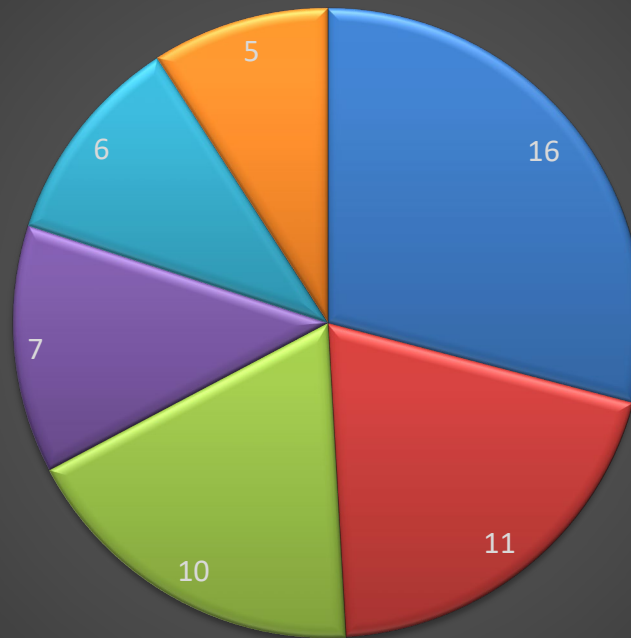
Non-Accidental/Non-Suspicious Death

- The death of an individual by natural causes without accidental or suspicious circumstances



Non-Accidental/Non-Suspicious Death

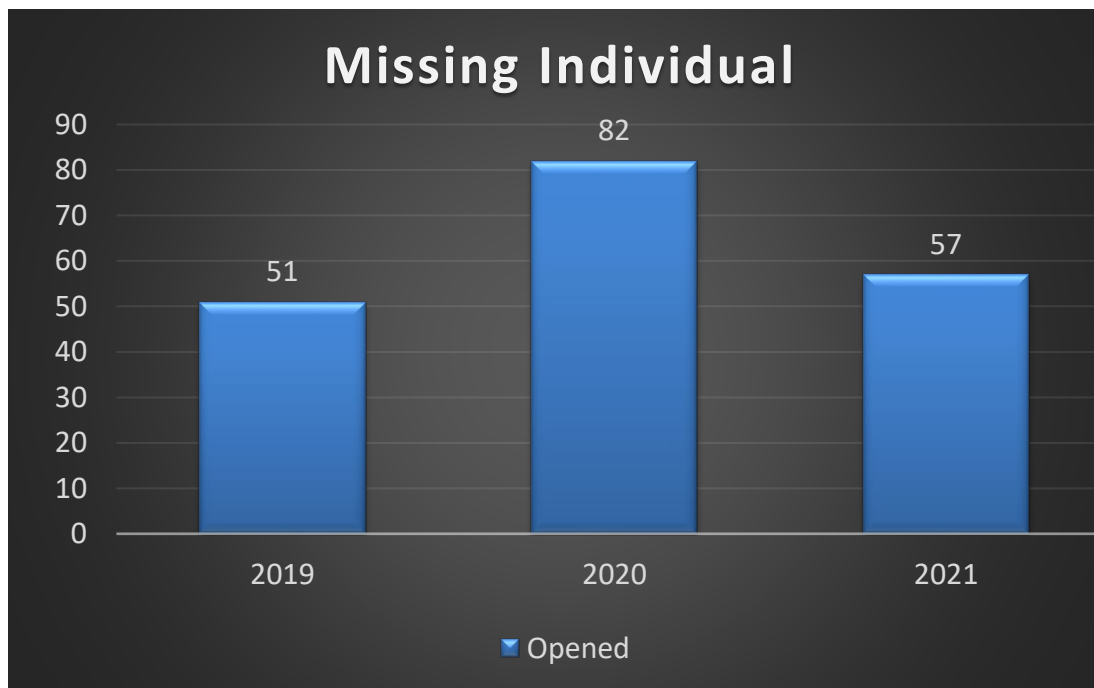
Deaths by Type

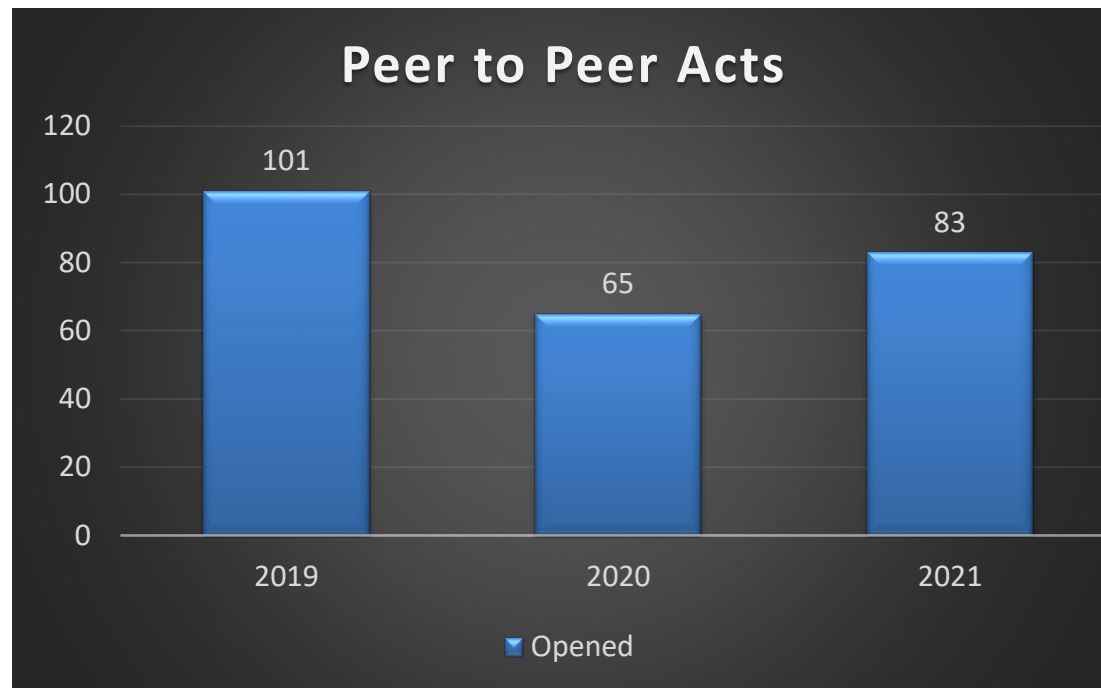
Missing Individual

- An individual's whereabouts are unknown and the individual is believed to be at imminent risk of harm to self or others



Peer to Peer Acts

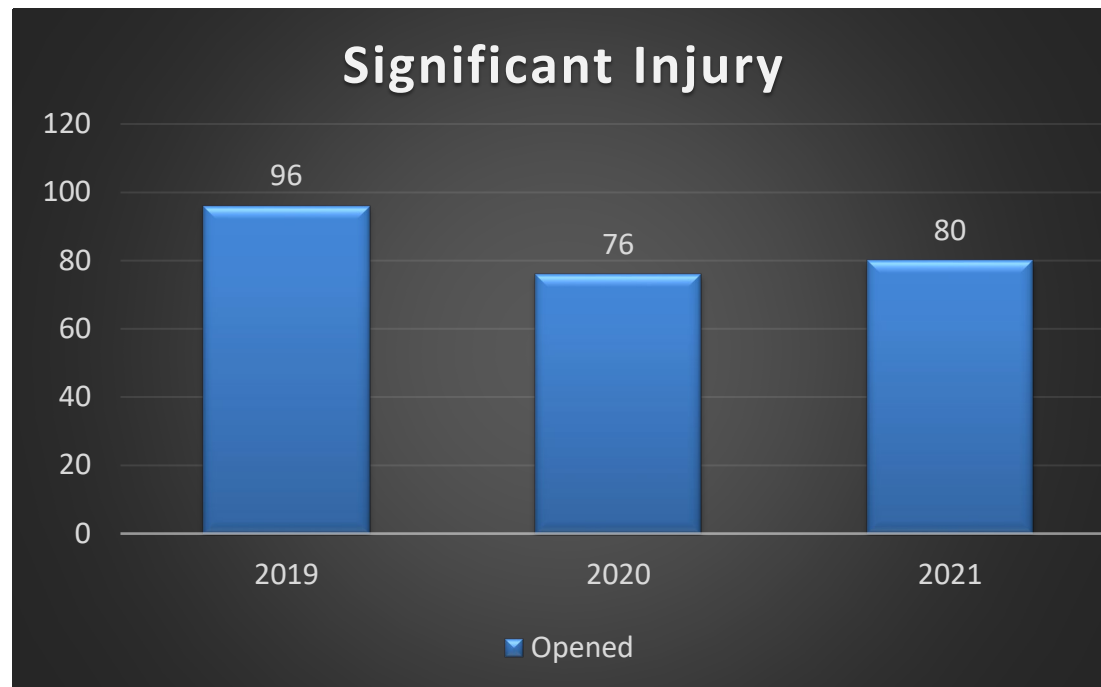
- Physical, Sexual, or Verbal Acts, Theft, or Exploitation between two individuals served (moved to category B in 2019)



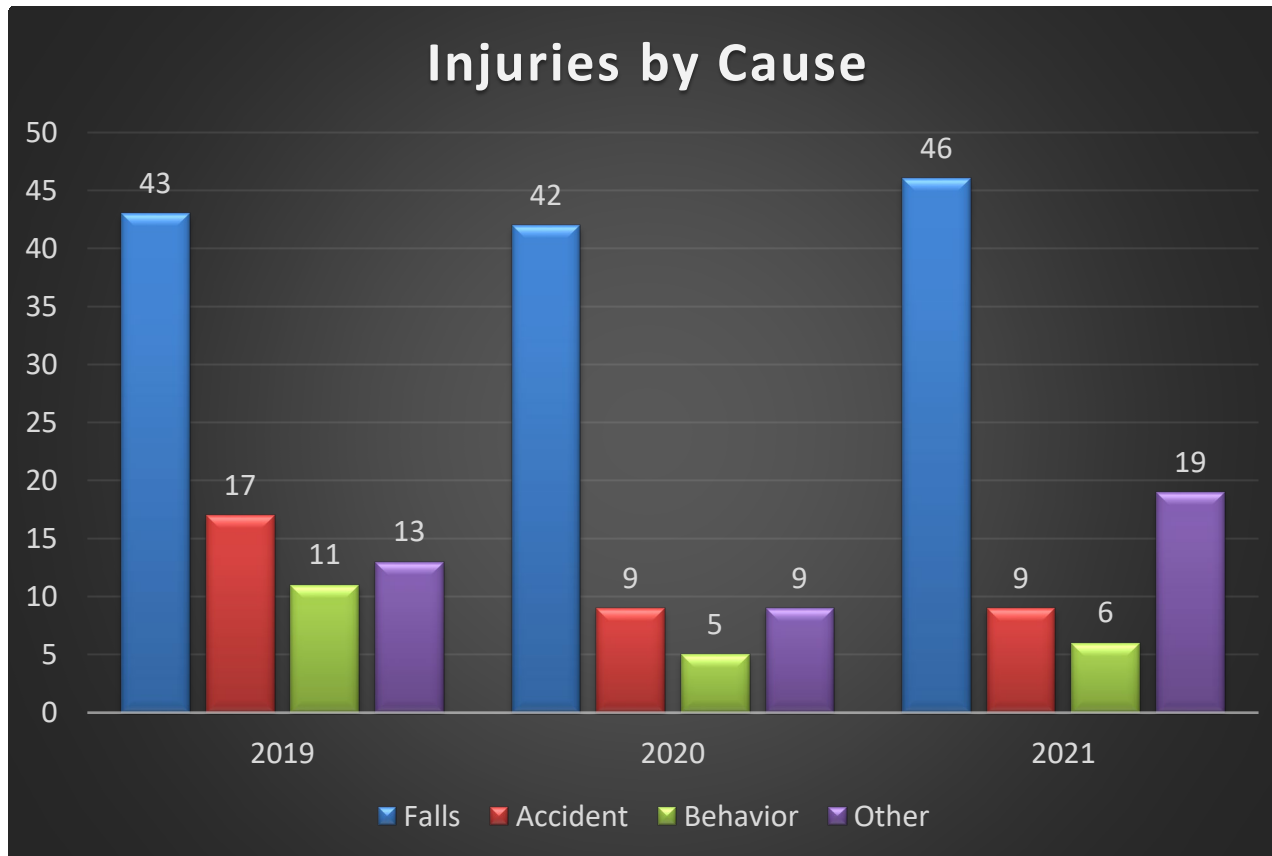
*Physical Acts were the highest instance of Peer-to-Peer types

Significant Injury

- An injury of known/unknown cause that results in concussion, broken bone, dislocation, 2nd/3rd degree burn, immobilization/casting, or 5+ sutures

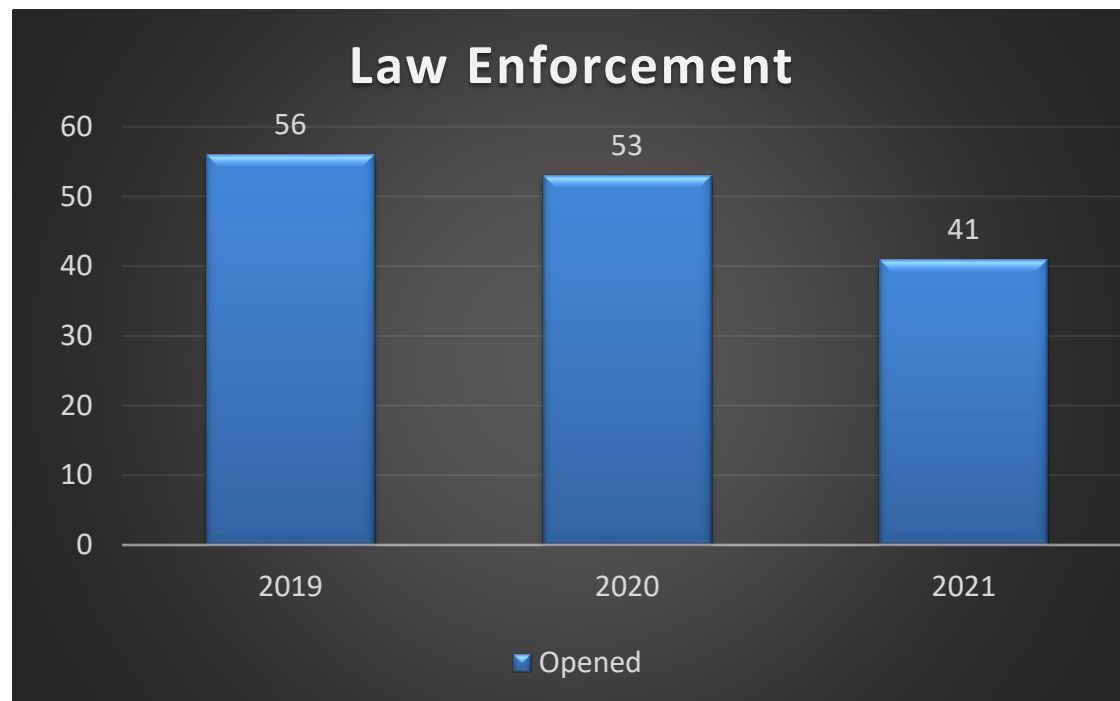


Category C MUIs

- Law Enforcement
- Unanticipated Hospitalization
- Unapproved Behavioral Supports

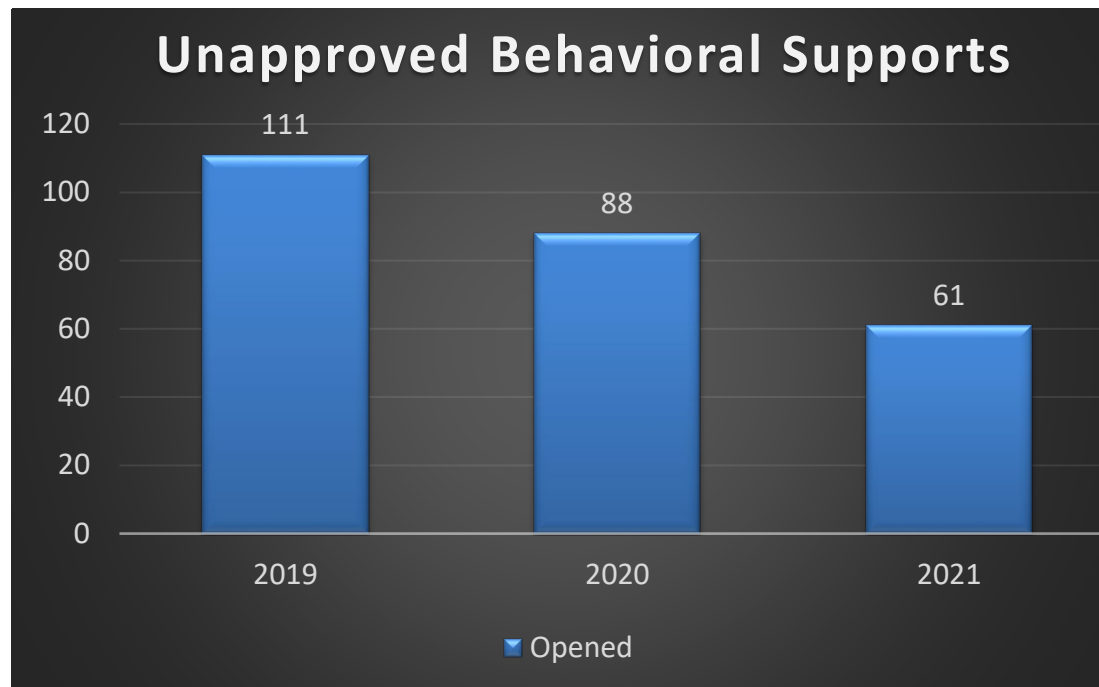
Law Enforcement

- An individual is charged, arrested, incarcerated, or tased

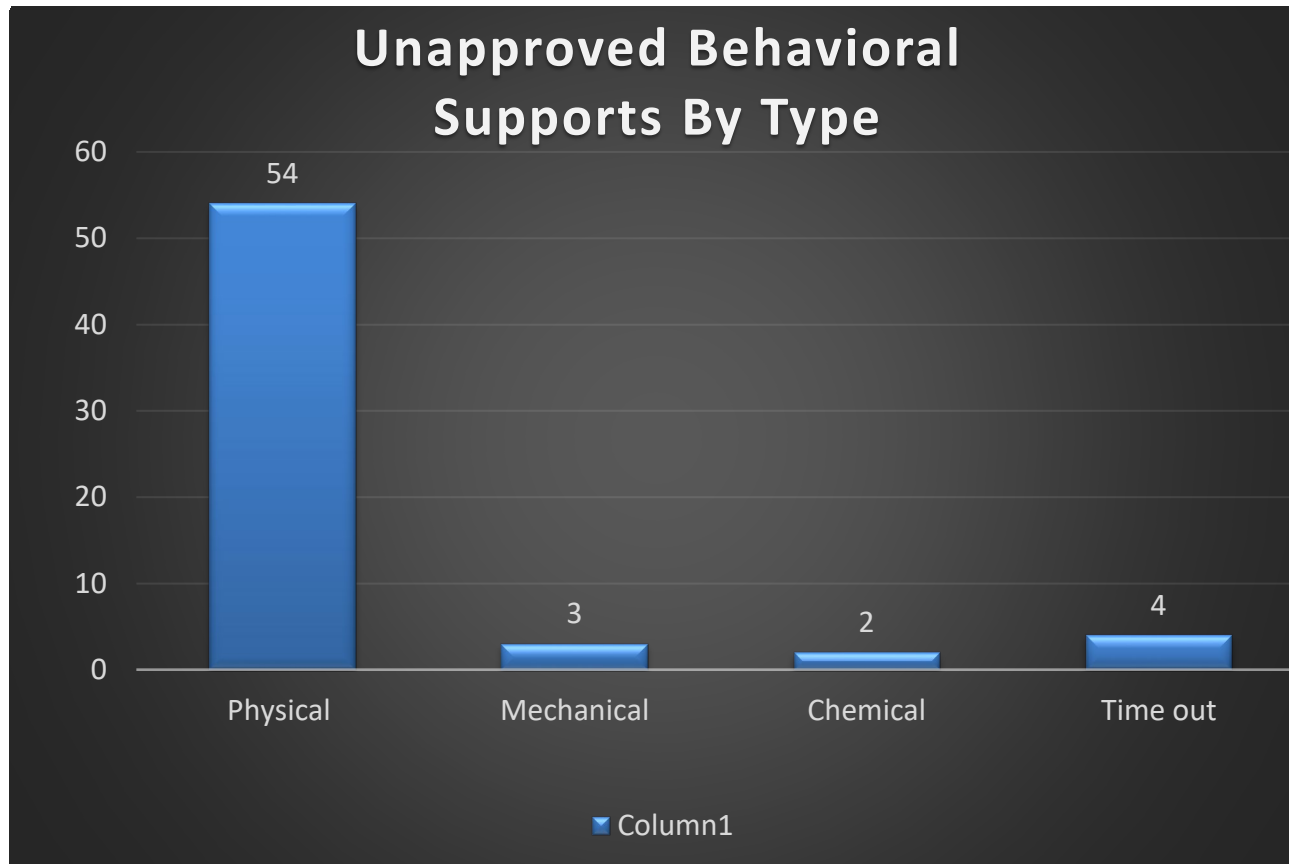


Unapproved Behavioral Support

- Use of a restrictive measure implemented without approval of the human rights committee or without informed consent, that results in risk of harm to an individual served

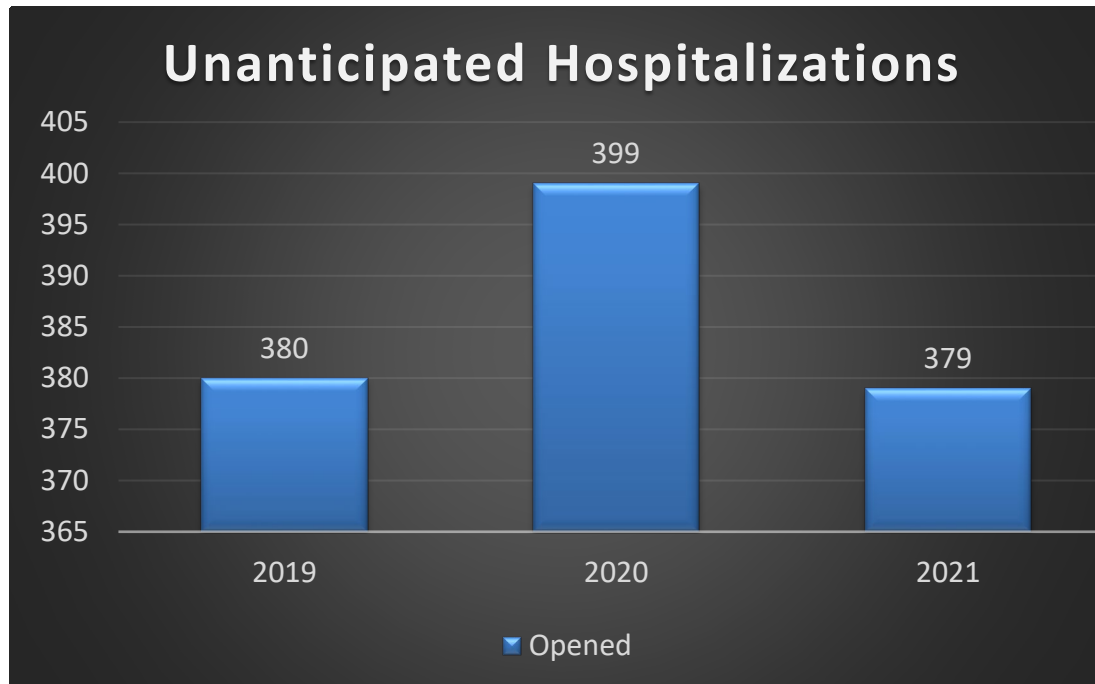


Unapproved Behavioral Support

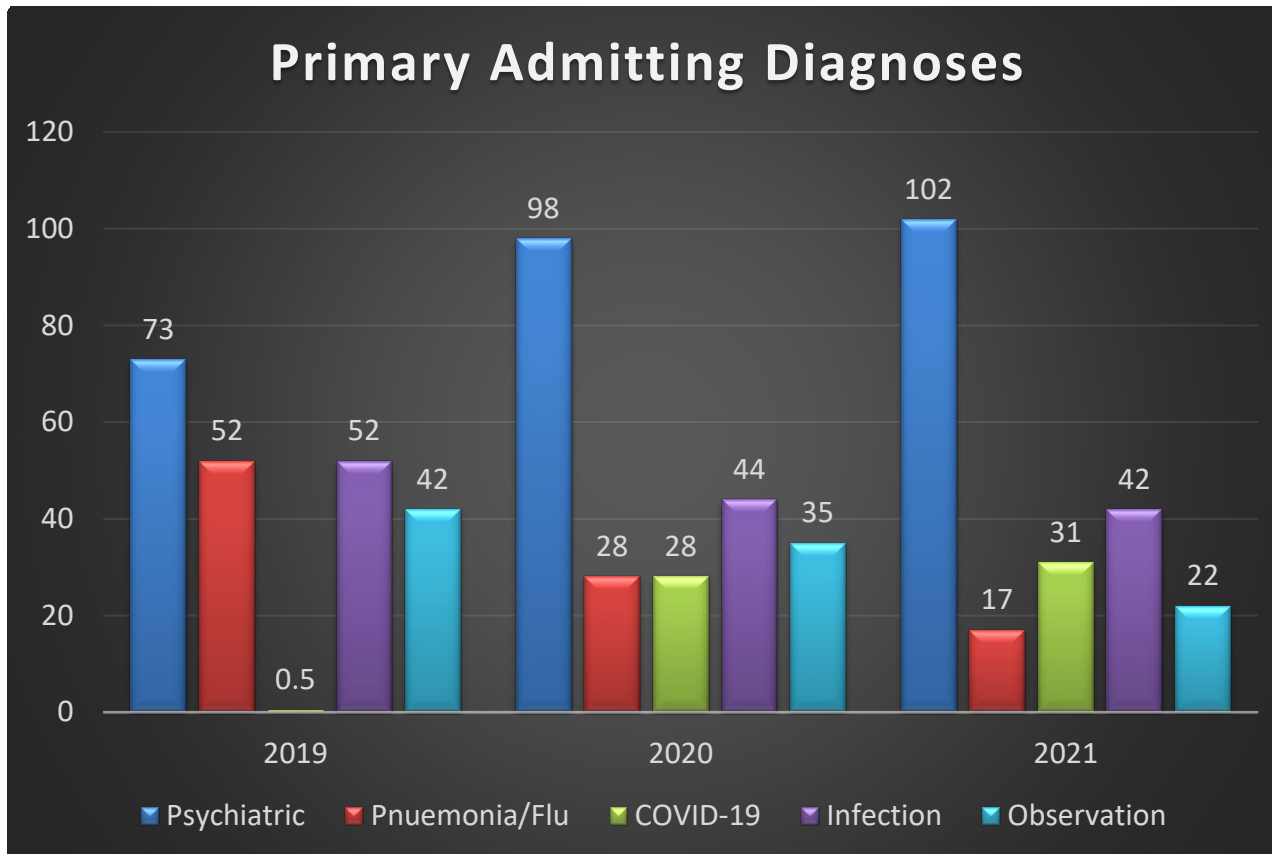


Unanticipated Hospitalization

- Any hospital admission or hospital stay over 24 hours that is not pre-scheduled or planned

How Summit County Compares to Statewide Trends

- The 2021 data remains significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, though counts for most categories are beginning to trend back toward expectations.
- There was a 3% increase in the number of overall MUIs filed in 2021. **Summit County saw a .002% decline.**
- Neglect allegations increased 17% during 2021. **Summit County saw an 8% decrease.**
- Sexual Abuse MUIs decreased 4% in 2021. **Summit County saw a 39% decrease.**
- Misappropriation MUIs decreased 1% in 2021. **Summit County saw a 26% increase.**
- Exploitation MUIs increased 18% in 2021. **Summit County saw a 38% decrease.**

How Summit County Compares to Statewide Trends

- Rights Code Violations increased 11% in 2021. Summit County saw an 84% decrease.
- Physical Abuse MUIs decreased 3% in 2021. Summit County saw a 24% increase.
- Significant Injury MUIs increased 10% in 2021. Summit County saw a 0.5% increase.
- Attempted Suicide MUIs decreased 1%. Summit County saw a 14% increase.
- Unanticipated Hospitalizations remain the most filed MUI category with 32% of all MUIs filed, which is a 1% decrease from 2021. These were 31% of Summit County MUIs and they decreased 5%.
- Missing Individual MUI decreased 4%. Summit County saw a 30% decrease.

Noted Trends/Patterns in 2021

- Summit DD saw MUI levels remain consistent with 2021.
 - Summit DD investigated 1238 total MUI categories in 2021 vs. 1241 total categories in 2021.
- Significant **decreases** from 2021 were noted in the following categories:
 - Alleged Abuse Sexual
 - Alleged Neglect
 - Exploitation
 - Failure to Report
 - Rights Code Violation
 - Missing Individual
 - Law Enforcement
 - Unapproved Behavioral Supports

Noted Trends/Patterns in 2021

- Significant **increases** from 2020 were noted in the following categories:
 - Alleged Abuse – Verbal
 - Alleged Abuse – Physical
 - Misappropriation
 - Attempted Suicide
 - Peer to Peer Acts
- 2020 levels that **remained consistent** through 2021 were noted in the following categories:
 - Unanticipated Hospitalizations
 - Significant Injury
 - Medical Emergency

- Verbal Abuse, Physical Abuse and Misappropriation significantly increased. **DSPs** were the largest group identified as PPIs. How can we better support those we serve to effectively decrease these alleged occurrences/allegations?
- How do we support individuals' **mental health**, and effectively decrease the number of suicide attempts?
- **Falls** continue to be the primary cause of Significant Injuries. What can we do to reduce falls?
